The french fry stand has been a terrific source of funds for the Band Boosters over the years.

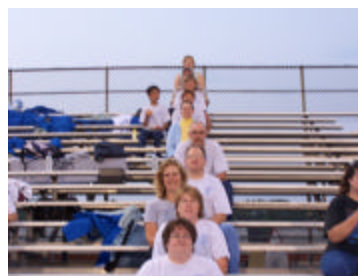
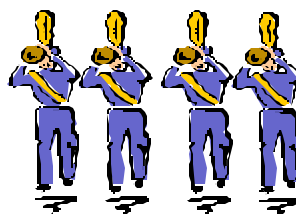

Yoder's Market has generously allowed the band to collect receipts year-round as a fundraiser for band students. With this in mind, the Band Boosters have initiated a policy concerning the collection and credit of these receipts. **Please make sure you are using the correct subtotal. Due to new Yoder's discounts, some receipts are not sub totaled. You will need to write in the adjusted subtotal amount below the total showing on the receipt. Receipts must be readable to be counted.**

1. The Band Boosters will only accept Yoder's receipts dated within our collection period.
2. The Band Boosters will only accept Yoder's receipts on the collection dates published in the newsletter and posted at school. **Deposit all receipts in the box marked for Yoder's receipts ONLY.**
3. Funds will be credited to the student's band account only.

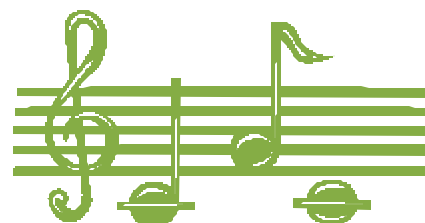

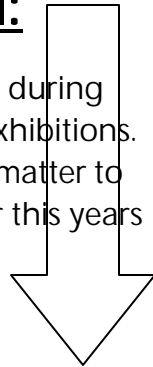
Next collection dates will be September 1, 2005 – December 31, 2005
